PROGRAM INFORMATION

CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION

Curriculum is chosen from a list of California approved curriculum choices, all of which are based on California State Standards and California Common Core Standards. Lessons are taught using a multi-sensory approach, which appeals to auditory, visual and kinesthetic learners. This multi-sensory style of teaching provides students with an opportunity to develop important 21st Century skills such as critical thinking, communication, collaboration, and creativity, all while emphasizing exploration and application to real-life experiences. Curriculum and lessons encourage students to read, write, speak, and listen at a high level across all content area. All subjects are taught from a Christian perspective and integrated with Biblical truths and principles.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The physical education program is committed to fostering skill development, healthy lifestyles, and spiritual growth through group games and activities that emphasize cooperation, teamwork, and leadership skills. All physical education lessons are based on California State Standards.

COMPUTER SCIENCE

Technology is used to enhance learning across all subject areas, both in the classroom and in the computer lab. Grade level teachers collaborate with the computer teacher to provide computer instruction that is focused on current classroom learning. Kindergarten through 2nd grade students have the opportunity to use iPods to practice reading fluency and addition facts. Grades 3-5 have a class set of Chromebooks that are often used in

conjunction with Google Docs to facilitate the writing process through production of rough drafts, peer and teacher editing, as well as publishing the final document. iPads are used by all middle school students to access textbooks, take notes, and make presentations through the use of Apple TV. Our campus-wide wireless network and Internet access are safely controlled.

MUSIC

Music is important to the developing mind. Students in grades K-5 will develop an appreciation of music through song and musical instruments such as recorders, ukuleles, violins, clarinets, flutes, and trumpets. Middle School students may also choose to enroll in Handbells, Concert Band, or Praise Band as elective courses.

VISUAL AND PERFORMING ARTS

The California Department of Education includes Visual and Performing Arts as a vital part of a well-rounded educational program. Combined with Music, our Performing Arts Program provides students with an opportunity to study the arts discipline through artistic perception and appreciation, creative expression, and historical and cultural context. Fine Arts will be emphasized through the "Meet the Masters" Art Program.

SPANISH

Spanish is offered to all students in K-5 twice a week and to Middle School students as an elective. This class is taught through auditory, visual and hands-on activities and includes a study of Spanish culture as well as language.

ADMISSIONS POLICY

Students who meet the eligibility requirements may apply to the school when the parent submits a completed application packet and the non-refundable registration fee.

Enrollment Eligibility Requirements

- 1. Parents and the student must support our goals and purposes as a Christian school, including our Statement of Faith, Religious Belief Policy, and Covenant Commitment.
- 2. Interview with the principal for new students and their parents.
- 3. Student must pass the entrance evaluation for his/her grade level.
- 4. Continued enrollment eligibility is contingent upon a current family account balance as well as continued support and respect of school philosophies, beliefs, policies, procedures, administration, faculty, and staff.

Enrollment acceptance is determined upon review of the application, reference (for middle school only), interview, and entrance evaluation results. A space will not be reserved for new students until the enrollment process has been completed and applicants are formally accepted by the principal. Priority consideration is given to current Red Hill Lutheran

Church and School families, siblings, and alumni. Should the student not be accepted to the school, a full refund of the registration fee will be issued. However, should the student be accepted to the school, and the parent declines to continue with the enrollment process, the registration fee is non-refundable and non-transferable.

Waiting List

There is a targeted maximum of 20-26 students in each K-8 class according to grade level. A waiting list will be created for accepted applicants beyond the maximum, and a second class per grade level will only be opened when there are a minimum of 17 students committed for the school year. Red Hill Lutheran Church members and school families with currently enrolled children at Red Hill Lutheran School automatically move to the top of the waiting list.
